# **RULE #1: TURN YOUR PHONE SIDEWAYS**

Unless capturing for the specific need of a vertical video or portrait photography, you should always shoot photos and video in landscape/horizontal orientation.








- Use natural light whenever possible. But avoid too much direct sunlight.
- Take more than one photo: multiple photos allow for more quality photos to be taken, rather than just having one or two blurry photos to use.
- Find unique perspectives: Perspectives can change/help the way an audience receives your message.
- Get up close to an object or action. Let the audience see what is
  happening.
- Get higher (use a ladder, stool, etc.) or lower than your subject; this is great for showing up close images of subjects that may be larger than your frame.
- Use the Zoom feature for further away objects or to get a wider angle for a more dynamic shot.
- Use the Grid feature for a straight and well balanced photo. Either place your subject on the left or right side of the grid or in the center.










- Use a tripod whenever possible
- Use standard camera movements
- Use two hands when filming for better stabilization
- Get to a higher vantage point when videoing events, people working in an area, etc.
- For better audio, use a secondary smartphone as a microphone to get it closer to your subject
- Always transfer footage (see last section). Never text or email video files from your phone to prevent compression and loss of quality
- Avoid distracting noises and background movement while shooting


















Always send images and videos in a large format file. This allows for the best quality when transferred to us for use.


### *How To Email From iPhone:*

- Open the Photos app > Tap the Select button in the top right corner, the select the videos or photos you wish to send > tap the Share button > tap Email
- Open the Email app > Tap above the keyboard, then choose a photo or video. Tap to return to the email.

## How To Email From Android:

- Open the Photos app > Tap and hold the videos or photos you wish to send > tap the Share button > tap Email
- Open the Email app > Tap Paperclip icon above the keyboard, then choose a photo or video to send
